# **Project News**

In 2012, Home-Start Colchester expanded its services to deliver individual projects to support local identified needs. Alongside our core Volunteer Home Visiting Service we received funding to deliver 2 new projects to support families with at least one child 5-11years and an exciting project to recruit volunteers to encourage healthy eating.

- Side by Side- Colchester & Tendring
- "I Can Do It" Colchester & Tendring
- Recipe4health- Colchester & Tendring

After a difficult wait after submitting further tenders we are delighted to update everyone that the scheme successfully secured further funding to deliver the above projects for a further 12 months till 2015.

Added to this good news, the scheme also secured new funds from The British Legion to deliver a bespoke project Together, to support both serving and ex serving families for 12 months.

#### Project Update



Volunteer Home-Visiting project supports families with at least one child under 5 in Colchester.

The project has now been reduced to 25% of its existing service due to funding cuts.

The CCG formerly the Primary Care Trust Fund, has committed to funding the project for the next 12 months.

55 children attended the Halloween Party at Jungle Adventure.

117 families were supported throughout the year.

The service supported 12 sets of twins and 2 sets of triplets throughout the year.

### **Fun Start Project**







We have applied for an extension of funds, so fingers crossed we are successful!

#### **Research On Play Deprivation**

Brown et al (2001) state, "For young children, it is play, not direct instruction ... that positively affects brain development. Brain scans of Romanian orphans clearly show that play deprivation results in biological regression of brain development. Baylor College of Medicine reported in 1997 that children who do not play develop brains 20-30% smaller than normal for their age.



The earliest information, although only recently published, (Brown and Lomax, 1969, in Brown1998), makes a link between play deprivation and violent and anti-social behaviour. In it Brown states that in a study of 26 young murderers, "normal play behaviour was virtually absent throughout the lives of [these] highly violent, antisocial men regardless of demography". Brown later concluded, "play deprived children are the tragic

forerunners of social and personal breakdown".

### volunteering fund health & social care

In April 2013 Home-Start Colchester was informed that our application to the **Department of Health & Social Care volunteering (HSCVF)** had been successful! Now we are already into the second year!



What we need to achieve this year:

- Organise and deliver 2 cookery workshops to children/young people during school holidays.
- Build confidence in primary school children to make changes in their own diet and develop the skills to cook healthy meals.
- Create a useful healthy menu book. Collect primary school children's favourite family menus and publish the healthier option (to include menus from a diversity of families).

On 30 October, 10) children ranging from 5 to 11 years took part in a cookery workshop at Weeley Village Hall to build confidence in healthy cooking and to promote behaviour changes around healthier eating habits.



They were given the amazing opportunity to learn some cookery skills from Ian Samuels, a chef with over 25 years' experience of working for world famous chefs like Marco Pierre White and Gary Rhodes.



The workshop took on a Halloween theme, so began with pumpkin carving, utilising the pulp for pasta sauce and

pumpkin cake. The children also got to experience making home-made pasta from scratch and creating dough ball eye balls.

#### "I Can Do It!" Project Update



The project supports children/young people aged 5-11 years with behaviour issues, with a focus on families where the child may be facing a communication difficulty that may be affecting behaviour.

Prior to Kate's departure she worked so hard matching mentors so support young people.

Not knowing the funding outcomes it was really difficult time. Angela came on board to take over the project and she will deliver the

service for the next 12 months.



Part of the project is to deliver peer support groups.

We delivered a craft session and everyone had great fun pumpkin

carving and making clay models.

The project met its target to support 30 young people. Our

Friends of Home-Start Fund also provided two sets of school uniform for two of our supported families, a wardrobe, 2 lounge carpets and a lawnmower. We also managed to source a support grant for a bed and mattress from Buttle UK. Two families also benefited from a holiday in Clactonon-Sea courtesy of The Celia Allen Trust

### Ann Lindsay - Project Co-ordinator

#### Who is the project aimed at?

Families with children aged 5-11 (primary school age), identified within *higher* Level 2 (Additional) and Level 3 (Intensive) levels of need.

The project covers the Colchester and Tendring areas.

#### The Side by Side Project

Home-Start provide a fully trained and qualified Mentor to support families in their own home side-by-side, offering support and guidance to build new skills, such as parenting skills, cooking skills, organizing skills. The Mentor has supported the parents to build resilience to cope with the stresses in life, gain better thinking and self-management skills, and improved knowledge on how to organise and manage their family.

Families who had previously been desperate due to their child's behaviour difficulties were making self-referrals to Social Care to find no services existed to support them. Now the Side by Side Project has bridged that gap and CAHMS are encouraging parents to contact the project when their child does not meet their criteria. The Family Solutions team have also praised the project and the importance of having this services that sits underneath their criteria, to offer an alternative support when criteria is not matched with Family solutions.

The project has attracted referrals from disabled parents who have been very happy to have a project able to offer practical support. The project has offered support with a flexible approach offering supporting at home, school or the community. The key has been to offer a flexible service. Demand has been high. Ann Lindsay has come over to Home-Start form supporting high level need families and brings with her a wealth of experience.

# **Staff News**



After nearly 7 years, Pauline Hillman, our Home-Visiting Co-ordinator is taking early retirement; she will be very much missed. We wish Pauline all the best for the future!

Pauline held the scheme together in 2011 when both the Scheme Senior Co-ordinator and fellow Co-ordinator left the scheme. Pauline also played a crucial part during recent challenges faced by the scheme, supporting the new strategic changes, and backing all efforts to keep the scheme open. Pauline has not only trained and supported many volunteers she has also supervised 2 placement social care students. The amount of families Pauline has benefited is vast on average 60 a year for 7 years = 350 families! She has been an excellent role model for both families and for staff, setting high standards to follow.

Feb 2013 saw Home-Start Colchester recruiting 5 members of staff at the same time! You can imagine how difficult this was!

Both Kate Wallis (I Can Do It Co-ordinator) and Charissa Debnam (Side by Side Co-ordinator) both found new employment - the uncertainty of securing further funding is always very difficult. Our Social Worker student Adrianna also completed her placement and left the scheme.

We are delighted to have employed two new coordinators to the team, Angela Hillsley as I Can Do It Co-ordinator and Ann Lindsay as Side by Side Co-ordinator. Both began employment on 3 month contracts and following the funding success we were able to offer both employees a further 12 month contract.

Angela's background is in Early Years, previous employment includes working in a nursery and pre school as a deputy manager.

Ann Lindsay back ground is working with families at high level of need. Ann has worked for Connexions and as a Prison officer and CBT facilitator.

Ann Elson has joined the team as Home-Visiting Service Co-ordinator and has been shadowing Pauline for the last 6 weeks ready for Pauline to hand over the reins.

Helen has joined the team as our Scheme Administrator, so at last we now have a full team in place. Helen is a mum of a little boy of two and therefore understands the need for a service such as Home-Start.

We have also employed Livvy Ryder and Bonnie Lee as Sessional Workers. Both Livvy and Bonnie were both Home-Visiting Volunteers prior to joining the team. Livvy has now been allocated the Recipe4health project to deliver.
